



## Partnership Spotlight

Partnerships are crucial because they benefit the people we serve in Haiti through Promise for Haiti. One such partnership is World Health Partnerships (WHP). They first heard about Promise for Haiti and Hopital Bienfaisance de Pignon a couple of years ago when they needed to send a patient from St. Louis-du-Nord to another hospital in Haiti for continuous nutritional care and a follow-up surgery. Through the grapevine, they were referred to Hopital Bienfaisance de Pignon where the patient received the care he needed.



Dr. Dan Richardson, a WHP board member, came for the first time to Pignon with fellow board members and our Director of Fundraising and Development, Caleb Bailey in February. “We loved what we saw,” Dan stated. WHP jumped right in performing surgeries and feeding the poor. They are now helping support our hospital with funds for specific hospital supplies and are helping Promise for Haiti organize future medical teams. ## Strength during the Pandemic

Pastor Moustaky Joseph is the chaplain at Hospital Bienfaisance de Pignon. Although Haiti is not exempt from the trials of the pandemic, Pastor Moustaky says, “It is true the church buildings cannot open for gatherings but it’s a great privilege for the church to join people and to have some great impact. I don’t really think having church buildings closed could or should be an obstacle for the church.” Pastor

Moustaky holds devotionals and prays with patients in their hospital rooms, at some patients homes and in his office. “I realize,” Pastor Moustaky continues, “many people are stronger in their faith during this pandemic as I am. I’m mentally and spiritually stronger. Praying and reading the Bible more. I’ve slowed down from being ‘religious’ to know Christ more. But the opposite for some people is also very real.

We find people abandoning their spiritual duties. This pandemic is an excuse for them to not be committed to Christ. This is an indicator that makes the difference between being religious and having a relationship with Jesus.” Please pray for our hospital, supplies to reach them, our evangelism ministry, and the people of Haiti to turn to Christ.

In our last newsletter, you may recall Anicia Joseph who had a tumor removed from her neck. Meet her daughters. Anicia's oldest daughter is Madeline Joseph.

Madeline was having extreme pain in her lower abdomen for several days until she went to Hospital Bienfaisance de Pignon by a motorcycle taxi. She was diagnosed with uterine fibroids and proceeded to have surgery for removal where she then spent six days in the hospital recovering.

Madeline says she is very happy and grateful to the Health Partners program. "In 2019 my mother had surgery to remove

a tumor in her neck. Less than a year later on February 11, 2020 I had surgery to remove fibroids. Imagine all the expenses that were added up and then covered by the

Health Partners program. We didn't have to sell our little piece of land to pay for the surgeries. This is a huge blessing for our family! We thank God and our sponsoring family for everything!"

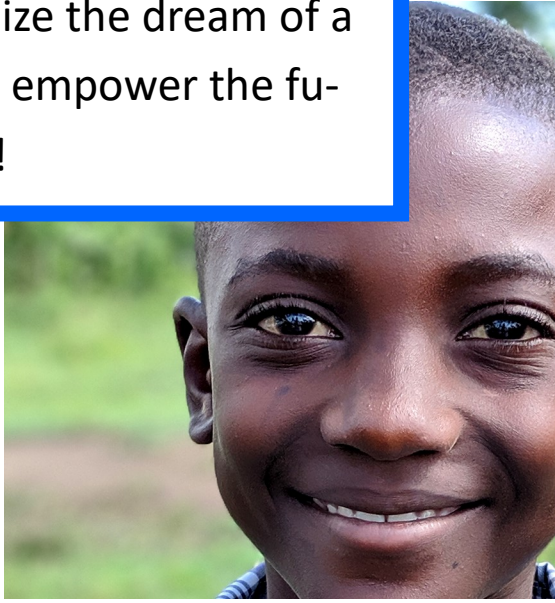
